

Bay View Pavilion

The Bay View Pavilion was originally built in 1921. It held a movie theater, a restaurant, and a dance hall. It was destroyed by a fire in 1928. Then it was rebuilt to become a popular performing hall. Big performers such as Benny Goodman, Duke Ellington, and Louis Armstrong played there. In 1940 the Pavilion was converted into a roller skating rink. Throughout the years, it was also boating storage, a tavern, line dancing, and in 2006, it once again caught fire before turning into a condo complex.
